

A WORD FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

This has been a very busy and rewarding year for Commissioned By Christ. Over 100 missionaries have participated in the mission life of the Catholic Church since January! We successfully completed 5 international mission trips to the Dominican Republic, Peru and Kenya, and 10 local, one-day mission trips. We have built homes, dorms and latrines; delivered food, clothing, and medicine; and accompanied our Diocesan priests to bring the Holy Eucharist to the homebound, bless homes and new babies, and anoint the sick. Every step of the way, CBC encountered Christ missionaries through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

In June, my husband and I were blessed to be a part of the CBC Peru mission team, along with our two teenagers. Serving together as a family was a profound experience for us. In the midst of extreme poverty, we encountered joyful hearts. My children witnessed our

beautiful Catholic faith being lived out far from the comforts of our own home, in houses lacking running water and electricity, with dirt floors and livestock running throughout. That week in Peru changed their understanding and view of the world, and it was very humbling.

THE FEMININE GENIUS: BY CAROLINE DUFFY CBC MISSIONARY TO KENYA, JULY 2017

The Feminine Genius in Kenya: "To serve is to reign"

"...society certainly owes much to the genius of women...The Church sees in Mary the highest expression of the 'feminine genius' and she finds in her a source of constant inspiration...Putting herself at God's service, she also put herself at the service of others: a service of love. Precisely through this service Mary was able to experience in her life a mysterious, but authentic 'reign.'... For her, 'to reign' is to serve! Her service is 'to reign!"" (St. John Paul II, Letter to Women)

This past summer, I was blessed to volunteer with Commissioned by Christ at Mother of Mercy School in Kenya. Eager to observe a religion class, I asked the principal for permission, and much to my surprise, I was informed that I would, in fact, be teaching the class of approximately 60 senior girls – in 10 minutes. Sweaty and dirty from the morning's work of laying stones and mortar for the new girls' dormitory, my mind raced as to what I should do. After a quick Memorare and some quiet reflection, it came to me: I would talk about one of my favorite saints, St. John Paul II, and one of his favorite themes, "the feminine genius." It seemed an appropriate topic at this all-girls high school named for the Blessed Mother; and as it turned out, these young women taught me just what JPII meant by "the feminine genius."

After a brief overview of JPII's life, I spoke of his devotion to the Virgin Mary and asked them what attributes she displayed throughout her life. I then asked the girls what their future plans and dreams were – what did they want to be and do when they left Mother of Mercy School? One by one, hands started to go up and all of the answers went something like this: "I want to study agriculture so I can teach families how to grow their own food so they don't have to go hungry." "I want to be a doctor so I can help save lives." "I want to be an accountant so I can teach families how to save money" and "I want to be an attorney so I can help women who've been mistreated by their husbands." After writing each response on the chalk board, I asked what each answer had in common: "compassion," "the courage to act," "selflessness," "concern for the needs of another." With tears in my eyes I concluded, "And that is the feminine genius." These "Mercy Girls" as they like to be called, live out that feminine genius each day – by waking up at 4 a.m. to do chores to prepare for the day, through their dedication to their rigorous course of study in which they take classes into the evening hours, through their warm welcome of CBC volunteers into their Mercy community, by their heroic perseverance through overwhelming personal difficulties, and certainly not the least through their beautiful faith lived through simple acts of generosity and devotion such as their daily evening rosary. Like Mary, the Mercy Girls are young women of deep faith, hope and charity with a zeal to serve God and to put their talents and gifts at the service of others – "a service of love." May their "reign" come!

ENCOUNTERING JOY: BY JEFF LUNGREN CBC MISSIONARY TO PERU, JUNE 2017

As my four kids have gotten older, and two have become teenagers, my wife and I have been looking for ways to help our children grow in their faith through serving others. At the same time, I have been seeking an experience that would get me out of my comfort zone, and more importantly, help me grow in my Catholic faith. I remember the impact my mission trip to Mexico had on me when I was in high school and felt a need to renew myself again through a mission trip. Thus, I signed up for a CBC trip to Peru, hoping to be rejuvenated spiritually as well as do some reconnaissance for possibly bringing others on future trips.

My trip did not disappoint. My faith has been strengthened; inspired by the humble people I met in Peru. Every day I try to remember how I saw God's image in the people there. How we visited the sick and dying – many of whom struggled to even speak – who nevertheless managed to pray with us for God's strength. How we met such beautiful children at the school and orphanage, who have little materialistic comforts, but were filled with a joy for life.

It struck me that while much of our mission efforts involved providing human physical necessities such as food and shelter, I found the people's gratitude, kindness, and joy was providing a spiritual food of sorts for me. I was assisting in merely providing them the bare minimums essential for human survival, yet they were grateful for what little they had and that we were spending our time helping them. Whether it was building homes, delivering food, or teaching basketball at the school, the warmth and joy from the people I encountered was inspiring. I look forward to living my faith through another CBC trip in the future – and, hopefully, sharing the experience with others in my family.

CBC missionaries are involved with on-going projects, including repairing houses for needy families, building chapels, and working on construction to improve the basic sanitary needs of the community. Piura, Peru (June 23-30, 2018)

This will be a 10-day mission trip, which includes travel days.
